El Shaddai - The Lord God Almighty
Jehovah Nissi - The Lord my banner
Jehovah Raah - The Lord my shepherd
Jehovah Rapha - The Lord that heals
Jehovah Tsidkenu - The Lord our righteousness
Jehovah Jireh - The Lord will provide
Jehovah Shalom - The Lord is peace
Jehovah Sabaoth - The Lord of the Angel armies
Jehovah Machsi - my refuge
Jehovah Uzi - my strength

We particularly pray today for our education system - from early years, through primary and high school, and beyond to further education.
