Hospital Chaplains:

- Please pray for hospitals as they deal with the backlog of non-Covid matters. Please pray for wisdom for the management of the NHS.
- Please pray for all those whose loved ones died from coronavirus and all those who feel a sense of injustice and anger as they deal with bereavement issues.
- Please pray for the reappointment of volunteers as chaplaincy is beginning to be able to open up again across the hospitals.
- Please pray for all the new and unexpected connections made with staff over the last 15 months.

Prison Chaplains: Many of us are reopening services - for us this is the first time in over a year.

- Please pray that everything goes smoothly, and that prisoners and staff are blessed by the services.
- Please pray for health. COVID in prisons can mean very large numbers of people ill so please pray that Covid stays out of our prisons.
- Please pray that many people choose to dedicate their lives to Jesus at this time.

- Please continue to pray for Lorna, John and the volunteers, trustees and management team and pray for them as they start to plan for the reopening of activities as lockdown eases.
- Continue to pray for work amongst those with mental health problems.

National and International

- Pray too for Nepal where health services have also been overwhelmed.
- Pray for wisdom for the Government as they need to make big decisions in the coming week.

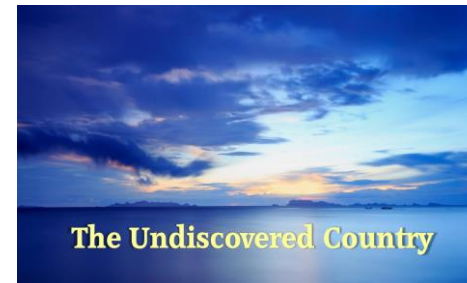
