Sunday

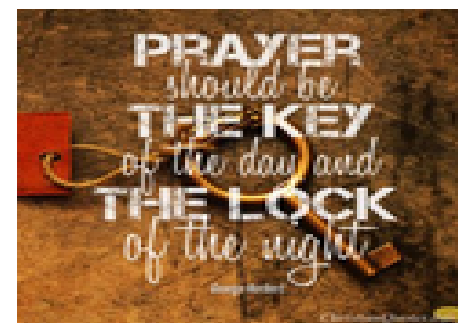
